3. Election results for IAREP President-Elect, Treasurer, and Secretary

Elections of president elect, treasurer, and secretary were due this academic year. The election announcement was emailed on March 16, 2021 and the election was held four weeks later, from

April 16 to 23, 2021. The voting was managed via Qualtrics software by IAREP treasurer Agata. Căzilia verified the results. A total of 71 IAREP members voted (53%); 133 members were eligible to vote. The newly elected officials will assume their roles after confirmation at the General Assembly on June 13, 2021.
